Information from and about our new music specialist: Amelia Giles

Amelia Giles - Biography

Amelia began violin studies at the age of three through the Suzuki method, piano studies at age eight, and formal singing tuition in her early teens. She has had many years of professional experience as both a violinist and choral musician, has attained a Master of Music in modern and baroque violin performance, and subsequently trained as a primary teacher. During this time, she also taught violin in several government funded initiatives, and in her own private teaching studio. Amelia's classroom teaching career started in South Auckland teaching Y0/Y1/Y2. From 2008 - 2018 she worked at St Cuthbert's College, Auckland where her role encompassed Y6-13 classroom music specialist teaching, string specialist work, directing an elite chamber orchestra, an all-comers string orchestra, the College's auditioned Y5/6 choir, chamber music tutoring, and pastoral care work as a tutor teacher.

When she is not in the classroom Amelia performs in a wide range of both project based and long-term ensembles including New Zealand's Baroque Orchestra 'NZ Barok' and the national chamber choir 'Voices NZ'. She is passionate about offering quality music education that is rigorous, joyful, and seeks to holistically develop the child as both as a strong musician and a person of integrity. To achieve this goal Amelia has engaged in certification study of Kodàly Concept music education pedagogy in New Zealand and Australia since 2014, being awarded the full 'Australian Kodàly Certificate' qualification in April 2017. In August 2017 she travelled to Hungary to study at the Liszt Ferenc Academy Zoltàn Kodàly Pedagogical Institute to complete a diploma specializing in Kodàly Concept Music Education Pedagogy and Choral Conducting and was made valedictorian of the institute 2017/2018 student cohort. Amelia is very excited to begin a new adventure in her music education career as a the sole-charge full time music specialist at Royal Oak Primary School and is really looking forward to fantastic music-making in this wonderful school.
