We are so fortunate at this school to have the calibre of support staff that we have. All of them work extremely hard and are committed to this school in a way that is second to none. I remember when we last had the Education Review Office (ERO) here that one of the team commented it was hard at times to tell the teachers from the support staff. It is also timely to acknowledge the support administration team we have here fronting the school office. Leonie, Pam and Nemia work well and truly

beyond their actual hours and their commitment to looking out for us all is greatly appreciated.

We also spent time talking with the children about kindness, resilience and strategies to counteract bullying. These three gorgeous children from Totara are seen here with the pink gumboot collecting coins to support the Mental Health Foundation. I heard the teachers talking about "Upstanders". An Upstander is someone who stands up to support anyone who is being bullied. He or she may take the victim away to play, leaving the bully behind. The Upstander may tell the bully to back off or here at school, get the attention of an adult to help the victim. It is important that the children recognise the difference between a proactive Upstander and a passive Bystander. At all times, we must keep talking to the children about acts of kindness and work with them on building their resiliency.


Bringing science to life with fun-filled, action-packed science and technology sessions after school and holidays for children aged 7 years plus.

Race registration from 2.30pm onwards First heat at 3:00pm (7yrs & under)

Entries: \$4 entry on the day
(NOTE - you don't need to be a registered club runner to participate)

The course will be marked & measured, making 1km.

Rather than competing against others, the aim of this event is to 'race the clock' for a bronze, silver or gold award. Times based on international guidelines have been allocated to each age in years, going up in one year increments so for a 10 year old boy the standard for gold is 3:45 and 4:15 for silver, while 11 year old standards will be slightly faster.

Children will run in age groups, where practical (age on 29 June).



Ribbons will be awarded to all participants acknowledging the standard achieved PLUS lots of spot prizes.
