#### Kids Sing 2019

On Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> August, almost 140 of our Royal Oak Primary School students from Y3 to Y6 travelled to the Auckland Town Hall to participate in the New Zealand Choral Federation Auckland Region 'Kids Sing' Choir Festival. Performing in the festival was the culmination of a term-long 'Kids Sing' focus in our Y3 to Y6 ROPS Choral Programme. The specialness of the opportunity to sing on the stage of the Auckland Town Hall—with its amazing acoustic and grandeur—was immediately recognised by the students once they arrived.

The children from ROPS performed as three different choirs. *ROPStars* (the Y3/4 invited choir), *Royal Harmonics* (the Y5/6 invited choir) and *ROPS Voices* (the Y3-6 choir where *ROPStars*, *Royal Harmonics* and absolutely anybody in Y3-6 who wants to be in a choir can sing all together!).

All choirs were accompanied very sensitively by our very own Anna Dean who has given up hours of her time in this pivotal role. On stage ROPS Voices was impressive in its sheer size. Their programme required singing in both Japanese and Zimbawean, and also showcased some senior Y5 and Y6 students playing percussion. Our Y3 and 4 students in their choir ROPStars were very steady performers and sang some beautifully shaped melodies. They also entertained the audience, including their Y5 and 6 ROPS peers, with some very cute chicken actions accompanying their second song 'Chicken on a Fencepost'. Our Y5 and Y6 invited choir Royal Harmonics were the very last choir of the day. As a competitive choir they were required to sing the test piece 'Red Diggers, Yellow Diggers' written by New Zealand composer David Hamilton. They combined this with a very maturely rendered, beautiful song for peace 'Et in Terra Pax', and a 1 minute 13-second-long speedy and sparkly arrangement of 'The Drunken Sailor'. Later that evening in the Gala Concert Royal Harmonics gave a polished performance alongside other competitive choirs in the Festival. It was fabulous to have so many excited parents, staff and supporters in the audience. Our recently retired principal Whaea Myers and Mr Myers were even there! The end-of-Gala-concert competition awards ceremony brought cheers and lots of smiles when it was announced that Royal Harmonics had been awarded a Gold Award - one of only four in the entire competition.

I am very proud of all the children who participated in 'Kids Sing'. Not only did they represent their school with pride. Their growing commitment, work-ethic, desire for musical excellence, and teamwork demonstrated during their preparation for 'Kids Sing' over the last term has been clear, with parental support of their efforts really heartwarming. Certainly observing the children in this journey has provided many moments of confirmation that singing in choirs is incredibly transformative in so many ways, and something <u>all</u> children should be given the opportunity to experience. Bring on 'Kids Sing' 2020!
