This letter is to let you know that a free open street food pantry has opened on 6 Chandler Avenue, in front of St John's Anglican Church, Royal Oak. It's between the Pak'n'Save carpark and Royal Oak Primary School. It is open 24 hours 7 days a week.



The pantry is part of the Pataka Kai Open Street Pantry Movement which is a grassroots, crowd sourced solution to immediate and local food need. As a church and part of this movement, we provide an opportunity for residents to share spare fruits, veges & any other excess food they may have directly into a pantry located on their street or nearby. Whether a need for food or a need to give, the Open Street Pantry Movement facilitates neighbours helping neighbours, building community.
