Kia ora koutou,

We are rapidly approaching the end of the term and a busy term it has been! The tamariki have been involved in a wide range of academic, sporting, EOTC and cultural activities over the past ten weeks. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our whānau for all the support that you have given to our kura so far this year. There are many things that we do that couldn't be done without your presence and support. We are extremely lucky to be blessed with such a supportive community - thank you all.

On another note, at Royal Oak Primary School we use Positive Behaviour for Learning as our behaviour management strategy. This encompasses our school values and is a 'way of being' for us here at ROPS. As part of this programme we engage in what we call restorative korero where conversations take place with tamariki who may have experienced some behaviour issues. These conversations are facilitated by our kaiako and/or our leadership team. Throughout any given day at school, there could be a range of incidents that take place involving the tamariki. Each person has their own perspective about what they may either witness or experience. The most important thing is that we gather the facts and that is the role of our kaiako and leadership team. Rest assured that this is done. We have a robust process for this. Sometimes it may not be obvious to others what has taken place.

There may also be times when there is the perception/opinion that it should have been dealt with differently. This may occur when people are not aware of all the facts. It is the business of the school to work through these things. I have become aware that there has been some concern expressed about what may have been perceived by some tamariki, who have then gone home and shared their concern with their parents. Their parents have then gone on to contact others to discuss the incident. Unfortunately, this is not helpful in any way, shape or form. In fact, it escalates the problem. It would be very much appreciated that the management of behaviour issues that take place at school is left to the school to deal with. If you do want to raise a concern, rather than talking out in the community, please contact myself or any member of the senior leadership team. Please do be rest assured that we do deal with behaviour issues. Thank you for your support with this.

Staffing

At the end of this term, we sadly bid farewell to Whaea Anne-Marie who is retiring. Anne-Marie Jammes has been teaching at Royal Oak for 27 years, so has a long history with ROPS. Her mother also taught here. Anne-Marie has worked closely with many of our English language learners over the years and has made strong connections with these families. I would like to thank Anne-Marie for the mahi she has done supporting our tamariki at ROPS and wish her all the very best for her retirement adventures. I am sure that she will pop in for a cuppa from time to time and will also be helping us as a reliever.

We will also be saying farewell to Whaea Holly from the Kauri Room. Holly will be leaving us to have her baby. We have loved having Holly as part of our ROPS whānau this year and wish her all the very best for her precious time ahead with her whānau.

We welcome Elizabeth Marriott (Whaea Libby) who will be replacing Holly in the Kauri Room. Whaea Libby has a background supporting tamariki with special needs.
