Dear Whānau,

We have been reasonably lucky with COVID-19 not impacting our kura to a great extent...so far. However, we are noticing an increasing number of tamariki either isolating or reporting as positive with COVID. We are anticipating that the number of positive cases will increasingly affect our staff and tamariki. We may even reach a point where we experience staffing shortages due to the need to isolate. We do anticipate that this may coincide with increased student absences and will endeavour to manage for as long as possible before considering the need to double up classes or close classes. Fortunately, the majority of our tamariki continue to be healthy and actively attending school. We continue to ensure that we are doing all we can to provide a safe, healthy environment for them by operating tight bubbles, staggering breaks, promoting good hygiene practices, cleaning, sanitising, mask wearing (Years 4-6, all staff, and Years 1-3 by choice) and ensuring that the rooms are well ventilated.

Please continue to monitor for any symptoms, particularly if you are notified of a positive case within the class.

Symptoms of COVID-19

- A new or worsening cough
- Sneezing and runny nose
- A fever
- Temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath

Other symptoms include diarrhoea, headache, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, malaise, chest pain, abdominal pain, joint pain, or confusion/irritability.

Whale's Tales

You may have noticed a number of whale's tails on display around our city.

Karaka Presents their Mini Whale Tail for the Whale Tales' Trail

Harcourts, Greenlane, kindly donated the mini whale's tail for a class to decorate for the trail that is presently on around Auckland. Karaka put their hand up to work on this and loved the process.

The Karaka tamariki researched the Bryde's Whales to find out as much as we could about them. We were excited that there is a large group living in the Tīkapa Moana o Hauraki /Hauraki Gulf. Project Jonah presented a Zoom lesson and we learnt even more about these majestic mammals, as well as other local sea creatures.



Students then worked in pairs and triads to brainstorm thoughts and ideas for our Whale Tail design theme. The unanimous decision after group and class discussion was to share the message of keeping our oceans clean and that litter humans drop gets into the sea and animals' habitats.

Next, working in small groups, the children discussed their designs and worked together to draw out their pictures. Many of them went for the



same background colours. A large group were also interested in the Māori patterns and their meanings related to the ocean and whales. Completed designs were displayed on the back wall in class for consideration and a few designs were combined to create the final choice.

The light blue front of our whale tail design depicts the clean, healthy ocean with healthy sea life, how it should be. The underside has a darker blue, showing what occurs beneath the surface due to human debris, such as plastic bags, which sea creatures get tangled in or mistake for food. Māori patterns represent the moana (sea) and ngutu kura (whale fluke) which symbolises respect for the sea and nature as well as speed, strength and protection.


