What: Oral care products, coffee capsules,

Where: At the front gate if possible

Why: We are collecting Colgate items to recycle. By recycling the

products we are reducing the waste in landfills.

How it works: We collect and clean the products and then send to TerraCycle to

be recycled.



In our Kauri class, we are currently working on a TerraCycle project for collecting coffee capsules.

WHAT: - We accept the brands L'OR, Moccona, Illy & Jed's (only aluminium).
WHERE: to drop off? They are collected outside Room 1 by Chandler Avenue gate.

WHY: By collecting aluminium coffee pods and depositing them into the box, you are reducing

the amount of waste going into landfills. TerraCycle will then shred the pods and melt them to be remoulded into new recycled products. This is an environmental way to save

our planet.





What: we are recycling Garnier skin care products, the products we would like are: Flexible plastic skin care

products, Skin care tubes and capes, plastic packaging and glass packaging including droppers.

Where: we would like you to drop the skin care products at Chandler Avenue gate.

Why: we are doing this for our community and the environment.
