This week our Year 5 and 6 tamariki have been transformed into engineers, designers and innovators, building large scale structures including bridges, cranes and machinery. They have been using their problem solving, critical thinking, and collaborative capabilities to follow a week-long intensive STEM curriculum. These cross curricular activities have helped them to develop skills in measuring, reading and listening to instructions, physics and new ways of participating and contributing.



We are fortunate to have invested in 3 of the EPRO8 kits over time which enables all Oaks tamariki to develop these skills. The extra 6 kits and supporting resources have been hired from EPRO8 for this week.

We are looking forward to the interclass competition on Friday with the top teams from each class competing in a race against time to complete as many challenges as possible. Huge thank you to Robyn McConnell for co-ordinating all the equipment and organising this fabulous opportunity.

Also, if you wish, you are now able to books slots with Whaea Sandra (for those tamariki who attend mathematics with her), Whaea Robyn (who leads our STEM programme across the kura) and/or Whaea Amelia (who leads our music programme and co-curricular music). It is not compulsory to book with these kaiako, just if you wish to.




Why not walk to and from school with your child? It's the perfect opportunity to teach your child road safety skills and it is good for family fitness.
