Tournament of Minds Auckland Regional Competition

Over the past six weeks, 21 of our students have worked tirelessly on a six-week problem solving challenge, mostly in their breaks. The divisions they competed in were STEM, Language Literature and The Arts, there were seven students in each team. The challenges are designed to push the students' creativity, divergent thinking and teamwork skills. Scripts, props, sets, costumes, sound effects, songs, mimes and dances were all developed throughout the three teams. There are many strict rules the students also adhere to. During the six weeks no adult, teacher or even friends are allowed to offer ideas or help in any part of the creation process. They also participate in a spontaneous



problem-solving challenge where they have 4mins to produce creative solutions to a problem presented to them on the spot. Over the six weeks they have been resilient, hardworking, solved so many problems and relationships within the teams were tested and strengthened. On Saturday 3rd September the students presented their solutions to a panel of three judges. With the spontaneous challenge points combined with the six weeks challenge, all three teams won their division! We are very proud of their efforts. The teams now travel to Wellington in ten days' time to compete in the National Event. 

Voting closes at noon on Tuesday 20 September 2022.




