

## <u>Go Litterless! By Noah, Toby and TJ - Karaka Eco Warriors</u>

We are the Karaka Year 5 Eco Warriors and over the next few weeks we are encouraging you to have litterless lunchboxes from now and forever. What are litterless lunch boxes? Litterless lunchboxes are when you have no plastic in your lunch box.

In New Zealand, every year around 15.5 metric tons of waste end up in New Zealand waters. Look at this whale, it has been absolutely implanted with plastic, therefore you should recycle and leave litter in either your recycling bin or your soft plastics recycling bin at home.











Here are some tips for litter less lunch boxes

- . You could leave your wrappers at home for your soft plastic recycling bin.
- . Use reusable plastic containers
- . Use beeswax wraps
- . Use lunch wrap paper
- . Use compartment lunch boxes
- . No gladwrap
