Flippa ball (junior water polo)

Flippa ball is a 7-a-side mixed team water sport. It is a modified, junior version of water polo. It is a great way for children to be active while building water confidence. It is played in a shallow pool (1.0m OR 1.2m -1.3m deep) and uses a range of ball skills, swimming and teamwork. Flippa ball is a great stepping stone into water polo with children learning the basic skills needed to take on the deep water at the intermediate and club level.

Children who play must be VERY competent and confident in the water and be able to swim. They must be able to play without having to hold on to the side of the pool.

Flippa ball is played in each of the four terms. Each term is run as a separate competition and registrations are completed at the end of each term for the following term's competition. You do not have to commit to all four terms but preference will first be given to those already playing in a team before new registrations are taken each term.

Games and training are run by parents and take place outside of school hours. Unfortunately, if there are not enough players, or parents available to coach for a year group we will not be able to register a team. Year 4 Cricket



Does your child enjoy science? Year 4, 5 and 6 ROPS students are able to participate in the Science Award Trust Programme. This programme has a large range of small projects related to the living

world, earth and space, materials and physical phenomena. The students choose eight projects to complete steadily throughout the year at home. This week Whaea Robyn will be speaking to each Oak class about this programme and will answer any questions about it. She will give your child a notice if they are interested in participating. The projects are handed in, or sent electronically, to Whaea Robyn who marks them and gives feedback.
